

### CAIRNS SHOW 16-18 July 2025

The Visual Arts Association and Cairns Potters Club are once again in charge of setting up and running the Visual Arts display at the Cairns Show.

Any club members entering works in the Cairns Show who are unable to deliver them on Wednesday 9 July can drop them off at Lone White's place—18 Duignan Street, Whitfield—prior to that date.

**Entries Close:** 4pm Friday 20th June.

**Delivery of Exhibits:** 12pm-6pm Wednesday 9th July - Visual Arts Hall, at the back of and under David Headrick Grandstand opposite Mulgrave Rd.

**Judging:** 10am Sunday 13th July

**Collection of Exhibits:** 9am-12pm Saturday 19th July. No responsibility will be taken for any exhibits left after this time. Exhibits not collected by Friday 29th August will become Property of the Cairns Show Association unless otherwise arranged prior to the conclusion of the Cairns Show.

#### HOW TO ENTER

1. Complete an Entry online or in person at the Cairns Show Office, or post via PO Box 811 Bungalow, QLD 4870.
2. Entries will not be accepted over the phone or after the closing date.
3. Pay for Entry Fees online, by direct deposit, or in person at the Cairns Show Office (cash accepted).
4. Entries must be delivered to the designated part of the Showgrounds by the due date time and date shown.
5. Exhibit (Class) Cards will be posted to the Entrant after the entry closing date or may be collected from the Cairns Show Office by prior arrangement.

#### PLEASE READ SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CLASS YOU ARE ENTERING THOROUGHLY

1. Each artist is restricted to a maximum of four (4) entries overall.
2. Each artist is restricted to a maximum of two (2) entries per class including Sculpture and Pottery.
3. All exhibits must be the original and unaided work of the exhibitor.
4. All exhibits must have been executed within the last twelve (12) months prior to the 2025 Cairns Show. Previous Cairns Show exhibits will not be accepted.
5. No exhibit can be entered into more than one class.
6. All two-dimensional work to be suitably framed and/or presented, securely wired ready for hanging and no larger than 100cm x 100cm. Oversized works and works not able to be hung, will be rejected.
7. Junior two-dimensional works are to be completed on card stock of A4 size, except Classes 25017 - 25022.
8. All exhibits must be clearly marked on the back/base with the exhibitor's name, address, price and whether it is for sale. Exhibits not marked will be classed as not for sale. A commission of 25% will apply to all exhibits sold and must be included in the Sale Price. Stewards will advise artists of persons interested in their artwork.

## A NOTE FROM OUR SECRETARY, Yasu Mackenzie:

**To all members:** To all members: if you're leaving greenware on the bisque shelves, please be extra careful when handling other members' work. We kindly ask that you don't lift pieces by the rim, as we've had several accidents recently where works were broken while being moved.

To help prevent this from happening, please place your greenware on the shelf from left to right, keeping pieces closely packed together without leaving large gaps between them. Let's all help keep each other's work safe.

## SHELVES AWARENESS!

Please make sure you're putting your ceramic work on the right shelf. Look for the labels under each shelf to know what goes where. Here's the breakdown:

- \* **Drying shelves** – label your work clearly with your name and date. (Work in progress form)
- \* **Bisque firing shelves** – for bone dry greenware ready to be fired.
- \* **Glaze firing shelves** – for bisque pieces that are glazed and ready for their final firing
- \* **Collection shelves** – for picking up your finished bisque or glaze-fired work.

## CLASSES AT THE CLUB

### **Advanced Wheel Throwing Classes with Carole Lomax (Members Only)** *Expression of Interest and restating interest: (Tentative starting date: 19 June)*

This class focuses on advanced techniques, including throwing off the hump for both individual pieces and repetition production. Spiral kneading for large amounts of clay will also be taught, and basic forms will be revisited to refine and enhance throwing techniques.

Classes will be offered in 4-week blocks at a cost of \$140. Participants must provide their own clay and tools. Each session will run for 2 hours, with only 4 places available to ensure personalised guidance. Participants must already be proficient in centring and raising clay.

## ***Diane Lignier***

I am an emerging ceramicist and potter. I live and work from a small home studio in the Tablelands area. I primarily work with mid fire and stoneware clays firing to cone 5 / 6. I am currently focused on making functional ware. I am inspired by nature and most of my work has an earthy look and feel. I incorporate a lot of texture into my work which contributes to the interest of the piece. I work with a variety of glazes and stains to achieve the look and feel of my completed work.

Working with clay was something I explored about 18 months ago. I was looking for an outlet away from a busy full time job. I took a four week introductory pottery class and have never looked back. I really enjoy working with clay. It provides you every opportunity to be creative and the focus is 'Mindfulness in action' and very therapeutic. It was exactly what I was looking for at the time.

My work is evolving into an expression of my distinctive style. I want my work to be interesting to look at but also nice to feel. The sensory experience is important and I encourage others to hold my work to get the feel of it. My work is something I want people to be drawn to, to pick it up and visually explore the piece to discover hidden details they can find within the texture. To me, pottery or ceramics are part art and part craft.

I work in my studio on weekends and when on leave. I look forward to the day I can give more time to my art and to teach others. That time is not too far away. In the meantime I look forward to exploring the amazing work around me and getting to know other artists in my area.
