### Raku Firing

On Sunday morning, visitors may also have the unique opportunity to take part in a Raku firing – an exciting, fast-firing technique with dramatic results.

### For Members:

If you'd like to display and sell your work during the Open Weekend:

- Drop off your pots at the clubhouse on **Saturday 16 August by 9am**.
- Each potter will be allocated part of a table for their work.
- Please fill in a sales sheet as usual.
- Members are asked to help out for at least a few hours over the weekend, whether it's assisting visitors, demonstrating techniques, or helping with set-up/pack-up

### We also need volunteers to:

- Greet guests.
- Assist with handbuilding and wheel throwing.
- Support the Raku firing process.

Even an hour or two of your time would be appreciated!



## Raku Firing Details

If you'd like to have your pots included in the Raku firing:

- Pots to be Bisque-fired –**must be delivered to the clubhouse by Friday 9 August** and must be **completely dry**.
- In the '**Firing order form**' please indicate that the pots are intended for **Raku firing**.
- Pots must be **no larger than 25cm x 25cm** and even in thickness to avoid cracking during firing.

If you're interested in learning about Raku glazes, join us:

- Wednesday 13 August from 12pm – we'll be mixing and preparing glazes.


If you plan to actively take part in the Raku firing on Sunday, let us know ahead of time via email at the Cairns Potters Club address.

Important: Raku Firing Safety Guidelines

- Only members directly involved in the firing may enter the kiln area during operation
- Required clothing:
  - Enclosed shoes.
  - Long-sleeved cotton shirt.
  - Long cotton trousers (jeans preferred).
- Safety goggles (optional but useful for smoke).

## **CLAY AND MATERIALS ORDER**

Unfortunately, our clay and materials order from Picasso's Ceramics has been delayed. Keane's have experienced some issues with clay production, and there have also been delivery delays from Walkers. At this stage, it looks like the order won't arrive until early August.

Thanks everyone for your patience and ongoing contributions to the club.

## **SHELVES AWARENESS!**

Please make sure you're putting your ceramic work on the *right* shelf (not just the one closest to your arm's reach). Look for the labels under each shelf to know what goes where.

Here's the breakdown:

- **Drying shelves** – label your work clearly with your name and date. (Work in progress form)
- **Bisque firing shelves** – for bone dry greenware ready to be fired.
- **Glaze firing shelves** – for bisque pieces that are glazed and ready for their final firing
- **Collection shelves** – for picking up your finished bisque or glaze-fired work.







### Advanced Wheel Throwing Classes with Carole Lomax (Members Only)


Thursday evenings: 18:00-20:00



I came to Cairns from Sydney in '93 and joined the Potters club shortly after; although I'm not a potter, I do hand building. I'd recently discovered clay and loved the feel of it, and making three dimensional pieces.

I made all sorts of pieces, animals, pots, and commissions. I became interested in our indigenous people and bought some manganese clay which fired to a lovely chocolate brown. I was so pleased with it I ordered a ton from down south and began collecting books with photos of early tribal people and made figurines which were popular with tourists.

I like to think of them in homes in Europe, England and America where they might encourage interest in Aboriginal people and awareness of their culture.
